



PhD programme of Smart Urban Coastal Sustainability

One general programme (180 ECTS), with four research topics:

- 1. Life Sciences and Biotechnology
- 2. Environmental Sciences and Biodiversity
- 3. Coastal Engineering
- 4. Social, Culture and Human Sciences





Admission

A joint EU-CONEXUS admission panel and a student quota per research topic. The entrance could be separated into two phases:

- 1st by the University (University's department) which will accept the students and
- 2nd by the EU-CONEXUS PhD Council (joint admission panel).

REQUIREMENTS FOR PHD DEGREE

Language	part of the Ph.D. Thesis, at least the abstract and conclusions, has been written and submitted in English or one of the other official languages in the EU, other than national language.
Research stay	part of the PhD must be prepared in another European (or associated) country (at least three months –typically 3 consecutive months but not compulsory).
Number and quality of published papers	1 accepted, 1 submitted in high impact journal
Number of international conferences	1 international & 1 national
Transferable skills	To be chosen by the student, but strongly recommended.

Organisation of the studies

COURSES

Flexible recognition (in ECTS) of courses and activities offer by partner universities.

Courses:

- Teaching and didactic techniques
- Research planning and organisation
- Data analysis
- Languages
- Communication
- Bibliometric skills
- ...

• **Exams scheme:** network or/and institutional exams.



Admission requirements

- Candidates must hold a Bachelor's degree, or equivalent, and a Master's degree, or equivalent, provided they have completed at least 300 ECTS credits.
- Candidates with a previous PhD may also apply.



Status of Doctoral Students/Candidates

- One PhD thesis scientific committee: 2 co-supervisors + 2 external advisors (one of them may be from host university).
- Meetings at least once a year (virtual and/or physical meetings).





PRE-DEFENCE

- Number of quality reviewers: at least 2.
- Assessment report compulsory and previous to public defence.
- The authorization to proceed to the defence is given by at least two reports by two European professors (full or associated with accreditation or equivalent, e.g. director of research with accreditation) coming from countries different than the one where the defence is organized.



Assessment

DEFENCE

Number and quality of jury in public defence/committee/council (including criteria for reviewers with respect to their role in PhD research):

- 5 people from different partner institutions with considerable research capacity. A maximum of two members from Co-Supervisor EU-CONEXUS Institutions and one more from other EU-CONEXUS institution.
- The members of the jury have to be in the specialisation of the PhD thesis.

Defence decision:

- The public defence Jury is voting. Members of the Jury are voting on the granting of the doctor degree to the candidate. The decision to grant a PhD Degree is taken if more than half of the Jury members vote in favour. The record of the voting is signed by all members of the Dissertation Defence.
- The score/qualification is decided by simple majority but in case of the maximum score/qualification it is necessary unanimity.



Governance and decision making



Governance and decision making

- a) The program is ultimately supervised by the EU-CONEXUS **Academic Council**. One member of EU-CONEXUS **Research Council** will be member in the Academic Council.
- b) The Chair of the EU-CONEXUS PhD programme will be **a PC PhD member.** This member will be elected each 3 years rotationally.
- c) **EU-CONEXUS PhD officer** will be elected each year rotationally.
- d) The **Ph.D. Council** directly manages the different processes related to the Ph.D. program: it selects the candidates in relation to their merits and the interview, proposes the training offer, monitors the progress of the program and assists the different **Ph.D. thesis Scientific Committees**.
- e) The **PhD thesis Scientific Committee** will be unique per each Ph.D. student.





Governing bodies and tasks

- a) The **EU-CONEXUS PhD officer** will check that the applications fulfil the mandatory admission requirements and will inform the corresponding University partner (1st phase).
- b) Each University's department (1st phase) will evaluate the application submitted and rank them according to a common criteria.
- c) The **Ph.D. Council** is composed by a representative of each partner institution and the Chair of the EU-CONEXUS **Research Council**.
- d) In the PhD thesis Scientific Committee meetings occur at least once a year (virtual and/or physical meetings), or when needed, and they are in permanent contact with the Ph.D.
 Council.



Admission procedure





- EU-CONEXUS PhD Officer will inform to the corresponding university about the acceptance of the students.
- Each University will manage the Doctoral candidate Agreement which will be signed by the supervisors
 + student + Chair of the EU-CONEXUS PHD programme.




Selection procedure

JOINT PHD AGREEMENT

Each University's department (1st phase) will evaluate the application submitted and rank them according to the following criteria:

Criteria	Rate (%)
Relevant academic background	0-50
Motivation statement	0-30
Any relevant publications, work	
experience or project, academic	0-10
prizes and awards, scholarships, etc.	
Recommendation letters (max 2)	0-10





- The Ph.D. Council will check and confirm the pre-selection established.
- The Ph.D. candidates will be interviewed by their future supervisors following this criteria:

Criteria	Rate
Research project	1-5
Strength	1-5
Disagreement	1-5
Past mistakes	1-5
Aspirations	1-5
Cultural knowledge	1-5



Selection procedure

- The Ph.D. Council after the interview will ranked again the candidates and they will select the best candidates for each PhD topic guaranteeing homogeneity inside EU-CONEXUS.
- List of Ph.D. candidates will be sent to the EU-CONEXUS Ph.D. Officer who will inform the corresponding university.
